12 1/2" unfinished (12" finished)

Fabric Amounts:

Light Fabric 6 1/2" x 38"

Dark Fabric 6 1/2" x 34"

Cut (See fabric layout to the right):

Light Fabric

From the 6 1/2" strip cut

8 - 2 7/8" squares

1 - 4 1/2" squares

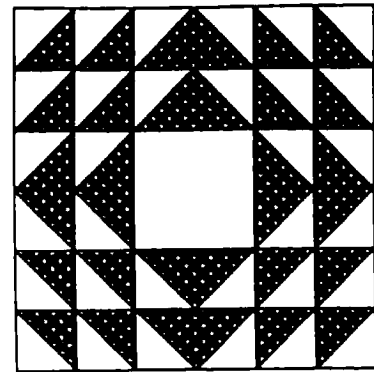
16 - 2 1/2" square

Dark Fabric

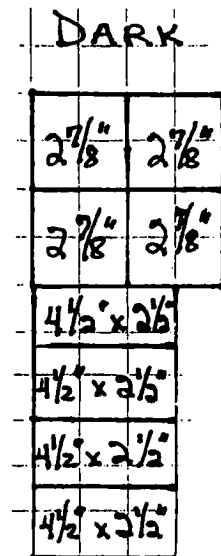
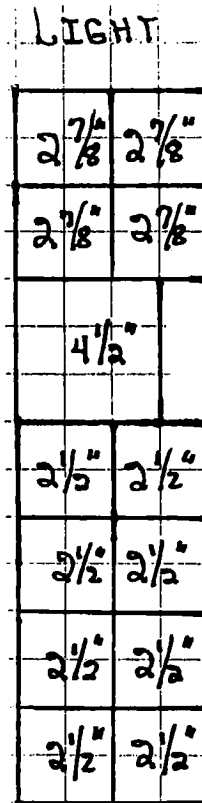
From the 6 1/2" strip cut

8 - 2 7/8" squares

8 - 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

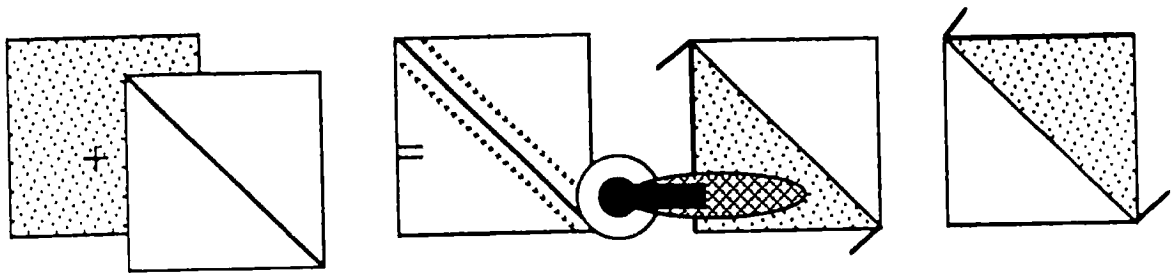


Fabric is folded in 1/2:
 (Except when cutting only one)



Half Square Triangles

Using the eight Light $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and the eight Dark $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner, on the back side of the eight light squares. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut the squares apart on the drawn diagonal line. Trim off the "dog ears".



Make sixteen (16).

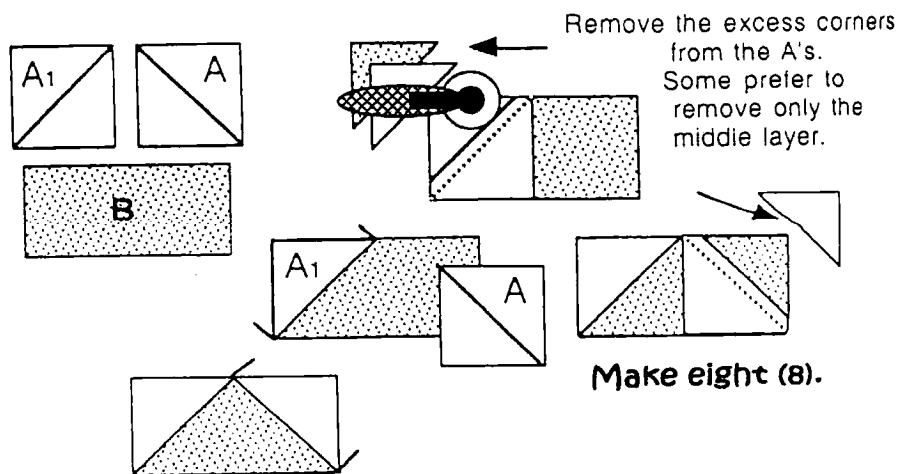
Flying Geese

Use the eight dark $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and the sixteen light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

On the wrong side of the 16 light squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. This is the sewing line.

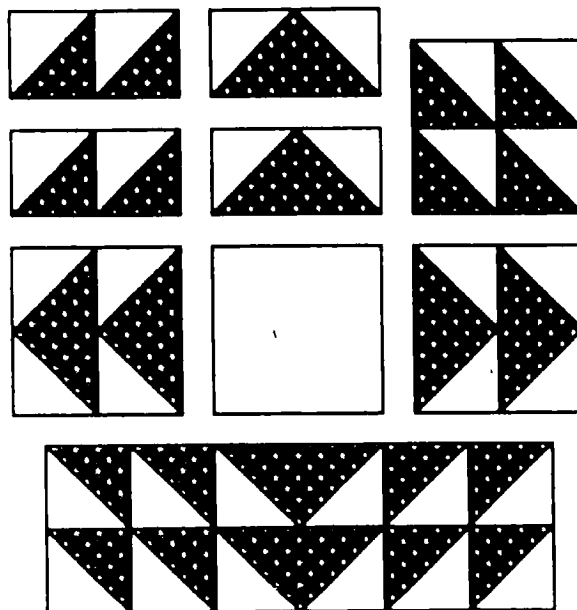
Place one square at one end of the dark rectangle with the diagonal line going from an outside corner to the center of the opposite side. Stitch on the diagonal line. Remove the excess corners. Some people prefer removing just the middle layer.

Repeat the process on the other end, sewing in the opposite direction. Diagram below.



Make eight (8).

Lay out all your pieces in rows or as shown below and stitch them together. Then sew your rows together.
